The Fellowship of the Physically Handicapped (FPH) provides economic and social rehabilitation for the disabled. Makes the disabled person skilled by imparting skills or vocational training so that the disabled person can get a job or work independently. A physically fit person starts working, that is, he stands on his own feet, then his respect in the home or society increases. This is a big job. Beanshikhau Divyangbandhu who enters this institution becomes skilled and leaves, so the frustration is removed from his life. Understand that his welfare is gone. FPH does such a good deed. It should be noted here that training is given to 15 to 20 year olds

People with disabilities have a choice to learn to work. He is trained in the department according to what kind of work he is able to do or what kind of work he has chosen. This is a unique NGO where the disabled are provided with training as well as tea-breakfast in the morning, lunch, tea-biscuits in the afternoon free of cost. Everyone is offered free transportation. Those coming from the suburbs of Western Railway are picked up from Mahalakshmi station and those coming from Central railway station from Byculla and return in the evening to the station which is dropped off and no fee is charged from them. On the contrary, everyone is given a stipend with four years of training. Which is the specialty of this organization. Often those who do less pickups are also given more time training. Venkataraman received the National Award for Welfare of the Handicapped. Tailoring Department Tailoring embroidery and block printing are taught in this section. In which bags, ladies-gents dresses are made.

Assembling department Mentally challenged people with disabilities are taught assembling tasks that do not require much brain work, such as making stickers, toys, swastikas, envelopes, lamps, paper bags, artificial jewelry, pasting, etc



Machine Shop The machine shop section teaches general and battery-powered wheelchair and tricycle making. Even those who are crippled but have good hands can do this work. Most of the wheelchairs used in Mumbai are made here
