





REPORT OF THE 19th RURAL CAMP (FIRST PHASE) HELD ON SATURDAY, 11th February 2023 AT DHARAMPUR, VALSAD, GUJARAT.

Mr. Hemantbhai Patel, Camp Organiser, Lions club was in touch with Mrs. Shobha Kamra, President, FPH to emphasise the dire need for a Rural Camp to be held in the area near Valsad District. After due diligence, they finalized Dharampur, Valsad district.

So, it was decided to have the 19th Rural Camp on 11th February 2023 at Dharampur, Valsad, Gujarat after discussion with Mrs. Shobha Kamra, in association with Lions Clubs International, Dist. 3232 F2, Lions Club of Reg V & VI, Lions Club of Surat Green City & Lions Club of Dharampur State.

Mr. Vilas Kolgaonkar, Asso. Hon. Gen. Secretary, Mr. Vijay Wable, General Manager, Admin, Accounts & Operations with 20 staff members went by FPH bus on 10th February 2023 at 7.40 a.m. Before their departure a small pooja was performed and see off was given by Mrs. Shital Dhanak, Asso. Hon. Gen. Secretary and the team reached the hotel in Dharampur at 5.30 p.m. They received a warm welcome by the organisers of the camp (Lions Club of Dharampur State) and proper arrangements were made for Lunch, overnight stay, dinner etc. for everyone.

FPH staff members took their positions at 8.00 a.m. on 11th February 2023 for registration and measurement. Physically challenged beneficiaries, accompanied by their relatives from nearby villages of Valsad and other district areas were present at the camp place and registration of 243 beneficiaries was received for various aids and appliances as prescribed by various orthopedic doctors.







The camp was inaugurated by Hon'ble Lion. Mukesh Patel, District Governor, and other members of Lions club. Mr. Vilas Kolgaonkar, Asso. Hon. Gen. Secretary and Mr. Vijay Wable, General Manager, Admin. Accounts & Operation, FPH briefed the dignitaries and the audience about various activities being conducted at FPH and also about 18 Rural Camps that had been organised by FPH in the previous years. The hampers containing products made by the trainees of FPH were presented by Mr. Vilas Kolgaonkar, Asso. Hon. Gen. Secretary & Mr. Vijay Wable, General Manager of FPH to the Chief Guests & Guests of Honour and other members of the Lions Clubs. The products of FPH were highly appreciated by Lion. Hemantbhai Patel, Camp Motivator, and other dignitaries present.

The measurement of the patients continued upto 1.00 a.m on Sunday 12th February 2023. During the camp, 243 aids and appliances were prescribed as per below mentioned table. These aids & appliances including the artificial limbs would be fabricated at the FPH Workshop and the total cost of the following aids and appliances is about **Rs. 13,70,282/-**.

EX-BRITIS GURKHA WANTS HIS EVEREST CLIMB TO CHANGE PERCEPTIONS AND DISABILITY

Hari Budha Magar, the first above the knee double amputee to scale Mount Everest, wants his ascent to raise awareness about disability. The 43-year-old completed the 8,848-metre climb on artificial legs.

Taking to Twitter, the Gurkha Brigade tweet read: "Gurkha veteran Hari Budha Magar creates history ...as the first ever double above-knee amputee to scale Mt Everest (sic)."

Bigyan Koirala, an official with Nepal's Department of Tourism, confirmed that his ascent is "a world record" and the Magar climbed the mountain with five Sherpa guides.

Magar had joined the British army in 1999 and lost both his legs after stepping on an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) during a patrol duty in Afghanistan in 2010. He said he had "suffered a lot" because of his disability and did not want other people to face the same pains.

"I hope my climb will change the perception of persons with disabilities, "Magar said at the base camp, adding, "I would like to encourage all people to take to climbing any mountain of their choice." Mount Everest has been climbed by more than 11,000 people, including those with disabilities like blindness and amputations.

SHEETAL DEVI GOLDMEDALIST



Teenaged armless archer Sheetal Devi on October 27 became the first Indian woman to win two gold medals in a single edition of the Asian Para Games by claiming the top honours in the women's individual compound event here. It is a hat-trick of medals for the 16-year-old from Jammu and Kashmir, who holds her bow with her foot. Earlier this week, Sheetal won a gold in the compound mixed team event and women's doubles silver.

"IF THERE'S A WHEEL, THERE'S A WAY"

It's not often that **Guinness World Records** reaches out to someone to say, "We think you belong in our book."In December 2021, Hassan Ibrahim, a senior public relations manager for MENA (the Middle East and North Africa region) reached out to wheelchair-bound banking executive Sujith Varghese to say just that. He'd been following the latter's social-media accounts, seeing the 31-year-old weight-lift and box, skydive and scuba-dive, participate in rap battles, deliver a TEDx speech. Score belief: A wheelchair can go down almost any road. It was a message that Ibrahim found inspiring. He texted the banker to ask: Could we look into you breaking a record? "I said yes, of course," Varghese says.

He now holds a Guinness World Record for creating the largest GPS drawing made using a wheelchair. The suggestion came from Guinness too. In early 2022, Ibrahim sent Varghese a list of 10 possible records to set. They included pulling a car, wheeling on two wheels, doing a wheelchair flip. None of these sounded ideal. "They just weren't things I could do." Varghese says, laughing.

A second list suggested a largest GPS drawing. "I decided to make a drawing of the wheelchair logo." Varghese started scanning routes that would let him trace this shape in Dubai, where he lives. "I had to form a big circle as part of the route. That was the toughest part," he says. The next challenge was finding roads that jutted out from that circle at the right angles, in just the right places."

In a manual wheelchair. It took Varghese 1 hour and 25 minutes to D complete the 8.71 km route, charting it via the MapMyRun app as approved by GWR. The record was certified in March. A steeply sloping section near the Dubai Mall posed a particular challenge. So ahead of the record bid, Varghese says he added a little more endurance training to his work- outs. "My body was very much in shape any- way. I was confident," he says.

"I pushed myself and started going to the gym and from then on there was no stopping he says. He is now a fitness influencer and ambassador for the annual Dubai Fitness Challenge. It's not about disability or wheelchairs alone, Varghese says. "Anyone can receive news for which they are not prepared." How does one cope then? What does one do next? He wants his life to be proof that the answer can be: Almost anything.


